

Our Identity And Purpose

Mathematics is not my strong suit. I mean sure I can add and subtract small numbers, but long division? Forget about it. I can remember many sleepless nights in high school where I found myself praying to God saying, "Please God! I am not asking for an A or a B or even a C, just please help me pass my math test so that I can make it to the weekend!"

The same thing is true for science. I can't tell you the process for distillation, how a liquid turns into gas, or

how to dissect a frog. Most of the time when I went to science class I was hoping there wasn't a quiz on the periodic table, and that maybe, just maybe, today was the day when we got to blow something up.

The only science class that I ever took that I ever really enjoyed was human anatomy, which was an elective I took my senior year. Here are a few fun facts that I learned about the human body.

- The only part of the body that has no blood supply is the cornea of the eye. Oxygen is obtained directly from the air.
- The heart of a human pumps 48 thousand gallons of blood over the course of a life.
- The embryo acquires fingerprints at the age of 3 months.
- 80% of the heat of the human body goes out of the head.
- A person uses 17 muscles when smiling, and 43 when frowning.
- The adult person takes approximately 23 thousand breaths per day.
- The size of the human heart is approximately equal to the size of the fist. The weight of the adult's heart is 0.5-0.6 lb.

Even though all of our body parts are important on their own, when all of our body parts work together, we can do cool stuff like throw a football, jump into a lake, or ride a bicycle. Encouraging all of the body parts to work together is exactly what the Apostle Paul is trying to do when he writes his letter to the church at Corinth, and here is why.

The poster child for messy churches is the church at Corinth, and reading through Paul's two letters to the Corinthians reveals that their church was deeply divided. Just one of the issues that divided the church was the division over spiritual gifts. The reason the church was divided is because people in antiquity were intensely aware of and concerned with social rank. Gender, class, wealth, education, freeborn or slave, urban or rural dwelling, and spiritual gifts, were all things that determined a person's social standing.

It was a fact of life that gatherings were occasions when the honorable were honored and those with low social rank were reminded of their shameful position.

Using the metaphor of the body, Paul is attacking those in the Corinthian church who have turned the assembly into such an event.

Paul writes, "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. ¹³ For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body - Jews or Greeks, slaves or free - and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. ¹⁴ Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. ¹⁷ If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? If all were a single member, where would the body be? ²⁰ As it is, there are many members, yet one body."

The message that Paul shares with the Corinthian church, is one that still rings true today. Unity and togetherness is the mark of the church. Each and every one of us in the body of Christ has different gifts, and each one of us has an essential function to the body as a whole. There are not some parts that are useful and some that are useless, for if one member fails, we all fail, if one member succeeds, we succeed together.

One thing that Paul is not saying is that we all need to be the same. In fact, what Paul is saying is the exact opposite. Diversity is beautiful and necessary because if we were all feet, there would be no body. But what I really want to focus on is how Paul closes this passage.

He writes, "The members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, ²³ and those members of the body that we think less honorable we clothe with greater honor, and our less respectable members are treated with greater respect; ²⁴ whereas our more respectable members do not need this. But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honor to the inferior member, ²⁵ that there may be no dissension within the body,

but the members may have the same care for one another. ²⁶ If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it."

Could you imagine what our church would look like if we carried this out? Could you imagine what would happen if we treated the weak as indispensable, clothed the less honorable with greater honor, and treated the less respected with greater respect?

As is common in many churches, it is the pastors who receive the most honor and recognition. We develop and lead worship, we preach and administer the sacraments, and we stand up here and face you when all of you are facing us. Most of the time, the spotlight is on us as if we are the only parts of the body that are essential. This of course is not true, because all of us are equally important to the body.

You see, the church is about love. Love is the greatest of God's gifts and that of course is what unites us and gives us identity and purpose. Love is not the same thing as control nor is love a competition, but love is communion and mutuality and having a common purpose. It is the sharing of all things between persons who are completely open to one another. Love is equality and most of all love is a desire of the presence of the other.

Brothers and sisters, I know that sometimes we have a hard time finding our mission and purpose. When life brings us questions, and hardships, and brokenness, it is really hard to know exactly what it is we are called to do. And that's okay! That is understandable! Heck! Even Jesus at times struggled to find his mission and purpose.

But as followers of Jesus, we make his mission ours. That mission is not one of bickering and division, but our mission is one of love and service toward our neighbors. Who are our neighbors you ask? The poor, the sick, the hungry, the blind, the captives, the oppressed, the brokenhearted, and the lonely.

This is our mission brothers and sisters, and should we fall into division all we have to do is look to the Cross. It is the Cross of Christ that unites us all, and it is in the cross of Christ that we discover our greatest gift of all, the love and mercy of Christ. That is our identity and purpose, and despite the things that could divide us, it is the cross of Christ that makes us one. *Amen*.

MISSIONS

"The Kitchen" was discussed as a four times a year commitment from Scandian Grove to host a meal. Two "The Kitchen" Board meetings have already been attended by SGLC members to gain information about hosting a meal. "The Kitchen" Board agreed to a contribution from SGLC of \$1,000.00 that will be put toward needed supplies. On Monday, April 3, will be the first event hosted by SGLC; 50-60 persons typically attend. Food for "The Kitchen" is to be made at the culinary approved kitchen of Trinity. Jay H. made a motion to approve \$1,000 to contribute to "The Kitchen" and agreed to as a congregation, serving four times per year, seconded by Dick, motion carried. Food Safety Requirements were stressed. The SGLC Council felt that this was a good learning opportunity for SGLC members to become educated on the topic of food safety improvements in general when we serve potlucks, funerals, and the Fall Supper. Heidi has regularly trained on this topic and offered to organize a discussion time for our congregation to be held during a future, after service coffee time.

Constitution: The Constitution Committee has met with the Synod Rep. Adam Roberts to discuss updating the SGLC Constitution which has not been updated since 2010. Members Include: Bill & Beth Kastens, Gordy Rodning, Beth Kinkeade, and Theresa Bjorklund.




