

Let Us Reach Out In Faith

The story of the woman who touched Jesus' cloak in Matthew 9:18-26 is one of the most touching and powerful accounts in the Bible. It tells us of a woman who had suffered for twelve years from a bleeding disorder, and who believed that if she could just touch the hem of Jesus' cloak, she would be healed. This story teaches us about the power of faith and the compassion of Christ.

As Jesus was on his way to heal the daughter of a synagogue leader, a woman who had been bleeding for twelve years approached him from behind and touched the edge of his cloak. She believed that if she could just touch his cloak, she would be healed. And when she did, Jesus turned to her and said, "Take heart, daughter, your faith has healed you." And from that moment on, the woman was healed of her bleeding disorder.

This story teaches us several important lessons. Firstly, it shows us the power of faith. The woman believed that Jesus could heal her, and her faith was strong enough to move her to action. She did not let her condition hold her back or make her despair. Instead, she had faith in the healing power of Christ and was willing to reach out to him for help.

Secondly, this story teaches us about the compassion of Christ. Jesus did not turn away from the woman or ignore her suffering. Instead, he recognized her faith and responded to her with kindness and compassion. He spoke to her with tenderness and called her "daughter," showing her the love and care of a father for his child.

Finally, this story reminds us that Jesus is always present in our lives, ready to heal and restore us. Just as the woman touched the hem of his cloak and was healed, we too can reach out to Christ and experience his healing power in our lives. We may not have a bleeding disorder, but we all have wounds and brokenness that need healing. Christ is always there to heal us and restore us to wholeness.

Brothers and sisters, let us be like the woman in this story, who had faith in Christ's healing power and was willing to reach out to him for help. Let us not be held back by our doubts or fears, but let us trust in Christ's love and compassion to heal us and restore us to wholeness.

Let us also be like Christ in this story, who responded to the woman's suffering with kindness and compassion. Let us be willing to reach out to those who are hurting and in need of our help, showing them the love and care of Christ in our words and actions.

And let us always remember that Christ is present in our lives, ready to heal and restore us. May we have the faith to reach out to him in our times of need, trusting in his love and compassion to heal us and make us whole. Amen.



<u>Call to Order</u> The meeting was called to order at 6:39pm and lead by Vice President Joni Anderson <u>Devotions by Pastor Matthew</u> - Mirror the Good Works of Jesus for the Benefit of All

Secretary's Report

Dick motioned to approve the June minutes with the amendment in the Treasurer's Report Checking Balance to be adjusted to "-\$625.49" and in the Property Committee Report to read "the windows in the pastor's office to be checked by the property committee", seconded by Dave and carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>

Vicki reviewed the report for the group. Dick motioned to approve this report, seconded by Pam and carried. Collin made motion to transfer from Improvement Fund to checking to cover the Northern Comfort two invoices totaling \$400 for the parsonage air conditioner repair, motion carried. Memorial Fund CD (\$20,000) needs to be renewed by July 13, 2023. Dick moved the six month CD to be renewed at 5%, David seconded, and motion carried. There are two additional CD's coming due in August.

Committee Reports

CONSTITUTION UPDATE COMMITTEE

Beth Kinkeade represented the Committee and reviewed several clarifications needed for the SGLC Constitution and discussed revisions and the Committee suggestions. They are awaiting a revision response from the Synod Rep. The Committee is soon ready for final presentation/approval from the Council who will set a Congregational Meeting.

PROPERTY

Three bids have been received for a new air conditioning unit (which is obsolete) for the parsonage. Bids were discussed. Dick made a motion, to accept the bid by Miller Refrigeration, St Peter. Seconded by Jeff and motion carried.

Hwy 22 easement on the East Cemetery - Settled - \$500 to SGLC is anticipated.

Handrail for Altar Step - Completed by Charles Johnson.

Repairs on Steeple - The Church Steeple was inspected and there is no source found for the leak. **WORSHIP & MUSIC**

Music Copyright - OneLicense acquisition was completed; this license will provide SGLC with the ability to utilize/print copyrighted materials.

EDUCATION

Green Lake VBS - Bible School at the Gaylord Park is in session and going well. Thirty two children are participating, with SGLC children accounting for about 1/3. Thursday night picnic and program at 6:00pm is open for ALL to enjoy.

Missions

Serving at "The Kitchen" - is next scheduled at Trinity in Saint Peter on July 17, from 4:00 to

7:00pm. Picnic themed meal for about 100 people will be served. Pork Chops to be prepared by Nicollet County Pork Producers. Volunteers and donations are being sought. Thrivent member sponsorship has been acquired.

Lutheran Social Services contacted a GAC employee who in turn contacted SGLC about helping a new Saint Peter family to settle into life in America. No additional contact was made to SGLC so it is assumed that another option was found.

HISTORICAL COMMITTEE

Sunday, July 23rd will be the 165th Anniversary Celebration of Scandian Grove Lutheran Church. 120 people are being planned for; egg bake, fruit, cheese and pastries will be served. A 30 minute video has been created. Former pastors are invited. There will be a brief program. The Pioneer Building will be open for tours. The Choir is planning to sing. A Free Will donation will be accepted to offset the cost of the meal.

Evangelism & Social Ministry

Care Team - This Team continues to make visits and meets monthly.

This is something to make you go...hmmm...where is my Bible?


Oh and one more thing. Unlike our cell phone, we don't have to worry about our Bible being disconnected because Jesus already paid the bill.


