# SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING To Approve The Updated Scandian Grove Constitution

A Special Congregational Meeting will be held after the church service on Sunday, December 3, 2023, to present and vote on the changes made to the 2010 version of the Scandian Grove Lutheran Church Constitution. Please reference the Special Congregational Vote Notification Announcement in the November 2023 Newsletter for details.

The first congregational vote to approve the adoption of the updated Constitution requires:

- → 10 percent of Scandian Grove's voting members shall constitute a quorum.
- → Constitution update approval requires a majority vote of those present and voting.

Pending the approval of the Draft Constitution at the December 3, 2023, meeting, a second congregational vote needs to be secured at the February 11, 2024 Annual Congregational Meeting.

The updated Draft Constitution has been reviewed and approved by the Southwestern Minnesota Synod. The Scandian Grove Church Council voted to approve the Draft Constitution as written.

- Paper copies of the updated Draft Constitution are available in the church narthex. Please record your name on the list if you pick up a copy.
- Committee members can be contacted to request an electronic or hard copy version of the redlined and/or fully updated Draft Constitution.
- The Committee welcomes your questions or feedback as Scandian Grove moves to ratify our Congregational Constitution. The Committee members are Theresa Bjorklund, Bill & Beth Kastens, Gordy Rodning, and Beth Kinkeade.



<u>Call to Order</u> The meeting was called to order at 6:32pm and lead by President Gary Miller <u>Devotions by Pastor Matthew</u> - Feeding of the 5,000 - Trust in God's Generosity <u>Secretary's Report</u>

Pam made a motion to accept the October Meeting Minutes. Seconded by Jay, motion passed.

#### Financial Secretary's Report for October

Collin reviewed the report for the group. Dick motioned to approve this report, seconded by Pam, and carried.

The Committee is following a Synod designated timeline that includes: Putting notice of the Special Congregational Meeting into the November and December Newsletters and specific bulletins; Special Congregational Meeting on Sunday, December 3 to review and vote on the final draft of the Constitution with the Congregation. Final vote on the Constitution at the SGLC Annual Meeting on February 11, 2024.

#### **PROPERTY**

Coffee Machine timer was adjusted by Collin with the help of the Bunn Company; now seems to be working better. Reminder to congregation members to empty and clean urn(s) after use. Motion made by Theresa to have the Bunn tech come and do a tune up with funds coming from the Improvement Fund. Seconded by Joni, motion passed.

#### **EDUCATION**

**First Communion Education** was held for Elise W with the body and bread to be given during the Thanksgiving Eve service. Joni made the motion to have a flower arrangement purchased in honor of Elise, seconded by Dick and motion passed.

**Christmas Sunday School/Choir Program** will be held Sunday, December 17 during the morning service time. Emily and Maddi will be co-chairing the Sunday School Program. The Choir has accepted the invitation to have a joint Sunday School/Choir Program. Special treats after the program will be served.

**The Education Committee** gave the recommendation to defer Sunday, December 17 communion as it would be served on Christmas Eve. After discussion, Dick made a motion to defer Sunday, December 17 communion to Christmas Eve, Pam seconded, motion passed.

Pam will lead putting together "Goodie Bags" for after the program.

#### **MISSIONS**

**Serving at "The Kitchen"** - On Monday, October 30, 97-100 meals were served. It was a busy event, 14 attended as volunteers. Tater tot hotdish and sides were served. In the future, SGLC will not serve at the Kitchen during the week of the Fall Supper. End of January will be the next opportunity to serve at "The Kitchen." The opportunity to help with clean-up will be added to the volunteer job list.

#### PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor Matthew reviewed the many activities and tasks he has been involved in throughout the month.

**Visitation Program** - Seminary student, Jill Norell, continues to attend classes and work on related projects. Pastor will attend Joint Visioning meeting and explore ways that involved congregations can be of support to this program.

Funeral Book being worked on. Tabled.

**Resources** - Reminders given to be conscientious about church resources by shutting off lights and fans.

**Fellowship Hall Chairs** - Discussion held regarding the offer of "new to us" chairs. Reviewed the pros and cons related to the decision to decline the offer. Council grateful for the offer.

to advance your own personal faith journey and preparation of your hearts for Jesus' second coming.




