If you wish to donate by check, please make it out to Scandian Grove and write "The Kitchen" in the memo.



Know That We Are Loved & Accepted

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ,
Galatians 5:1 says, "It is for freedom that Christ has
set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery."
These words from the Apostle Paul remind us of the
incredible gift of freedom that we have received
through Jesus Christ.

As Christians, we often talk about freedom from sin and death, and rightly so. Through Christ's death and resurrection, we have been set free from the power

of sin and death, and we have been given new life in Him. This is a freedom that we could never earn or achieve on our own, but one that has been freely given to us by God's grace.

But what does it mean to stand firm and not be burdened again by a yoke of slavery? Paul is warning us against the temptation to turn back to the law as a means of earning our salvation or maintaining our relationship with God. The law, which includes things like circumcision and following dietary restrictions, was given to God's people in the Old Testament as a way to set them apart and to remind them of their need for a Savior. But when we try to use the law as a means of earning God's favor, we are burdening ourselves with a yoke of slavery that we were never meant to bear.

So how do we stand firm in our freedom? By putting our faith in Jesus Christ and relying on His grace and mercy, rather than our own efforts. We can trust that Christ has already done everything necessary for our salvation, and that nothing we do can earn us more favor with God. Instead, we can live in the freedom and joy that comes from knowing that we are loved and accepted by God, not because of what we have done, but because of who He is.

As we go about our daily lives, let us remember the freedom that we have in Christ, and let us live in a way that reflects that freedom to those around us. May we stand firm in the truth of the gospel, and may we never again be burdened by a yoke of slavery.

Treasurer's Report

David reviewed the report for the group. Pam motioned to approve this report, seconded by Dick and carried.

Committee Reports

CONSTITUTION UPDATE COMMITTEE

Bill Kastens, a member of the Committee, presented the redlined copy of the Updated Constitution. Special acknowledgement to the Committee for their efforts and to Beth Kinkeade for her organizational efforts, to keep minutes and to keep the Committee moving forward. The updated Constitution has been forwarded to our Synod Rep for review; no response as of yet. The SGLC Council now has the duty of reviewing the Constitution by the July Council meeting and giving input.

PROPERTY

Hwy 22 easement on the East Cemetery - To accommodate the Highway 22 road project taking place in the future, Scandian Grove has been offered payment for an easement on the East Cemetery. After discussion, Dick made a motion that the contract from the MN Department of Transportation be accepted; seconded by Pam. It was signed by SGLC Council President and Vice President. SGLC will be paid \$500 for the easement land.

Handrail for Altar Step - Being investigated.

Trees - Trees planted in the North Grove and in the park. Clean up of the windbreak to continue.

Repairs - Fan issues and toilet issues in the kitchen bathroom were managed by the Property Committee Members; issues seem to be resolved. Capacitor for the parsonage vintage air conditioner was replaced.

Steeple - Property Committee Member to contact contractor regarding where/why the moisture coming into the sanctuary. Windows in pastor's office to be checked by contractor and give a bid.

WORSHIP & MUSIC

Music Copyright - One License acquisition continues to be worked on by Marie E and Vicki H.

EDUCATION

Green Lake VBS - So far, ten children from SGLC are planning to attend. Numbers from other churches are not known. Children going into kindergarten thru 6th grade are eligible. The full cost for Green Lake to lead a child is \$100 for the four days. SGLC will pay \$60, registrant to pay \$40. Scholarships are available through Scandian Grove by speaking with Pastor Matthew.

MISSIONS

Serving at "The Kitchen" - is next scheduled in Saint Peter on July 17th. Picnic themed meal for about 100 people will be served. Volunteers, donations and food being sought. Sign-up sheet to be put on the counter.

Lutheran Social Services contacted a GAC employee about a family needing help with settling into the Saint Peter area. Scandian Grove was forwarded the information. It was questioned whether the Islamic Center provides the types of services needed. They will be contacted to help direct assistance.

HISTORICAL COMMITTEE

Sunday, July 23rd will be the 165th Anniversary Celebration of Scandian Grove Lutheran Church. The meal will be catered by Gustavus; a free will donation will be accepted to help cover costs. After discussion, Dick motioned for the church to cover any expenses over and above the free will donation, seconded by Collin.

EVANGELISM & SOCIAL MINISTRY

It was clarified that the purpose of the Care Team is to *supplement* the work of Pastor Matthew and this Committee, *not* to take its place. Team Members to help coordinate people who may be willing to drive those who desire transportation to Scandian Grove for worship services. Church members willing to help with transportation and/or those who desire a ride to church services to contact Pam or an Evangelism & Social Ministry Team Member.

Care Team - Moving forward with visiting and activities. Members seem receptive to visits.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor Matthew reviewed the many activities and tasks he has been involved in throughout the month.

Old Business

Training on Defibrillator Use - to be provided on July 16 at coffee time. Jeff Allerson will teach this important training session.

Council Retreat - A Council Retreat was discussed and it was decided it would be a beneficial opportunity. Possible topics to be included: Goal Setting, Donation Wish Lists, Constitution Review, Grow as Spiritual Leaders. Morning of Saturday, September 9, 2023, then after Annual Meeting in 2024 with new Council Members.

Pictures From Library - Are being worked on and will be put into an album. Tabled.

New Business

Member Transfer - David made a motion and Jeff seconded the approval of the transfer of Holly, Henry, Arthur, Gretta and Winston Hokenson to Peace Lutheran Church in Watertown. Motion passed.

Beer and Hymns - SGLC being asked by Trinity and St Paul's to co-sponsor Beer and Hymns in August. The Council agreed to co-sponsor.

South African Partnership - Thursday, August 31, 6:00-8:00pm. Pastor Bob Stover asked that Scandian Grove host the meeting of the South African Partnership by providing the Fellowship Hall for the meeting and a meal for 10-15 people. Gary will speak with possible persons to put together the meal.

GIFT Sunday Update - Council discussion centered around the success of the Sundays. There was concern for the number of gatherings on top of events already happening within the churches and churches being left empty on so many Sundays. For the future, the Visioning Committee made the decision that in the upcoming year, there will be 3 GIFT Sundays when SGLC, Trinity and St Paul's will join together to worship, each church to create a "Signature Sunday" to plan for.

Graduate Recognition - Sunday, June 18. Council to provide cake/ice Cream. Gary will order cake, Pam to purchase ice cream. Service options discussed to recognize the Graduates during and after the service.

Church At The Fair - SGLC to lead church services at the Nicollet County Fair on Sunday, August 13. Pastor will preach and volunteers will be sought. Thrivent Action Team sponsorship will be sought to help with an after service treat for those in attendance; please contact someone on the Council if you are willing to share your Action Team Dollars.



Laddie Dosedel, who's hometown is West Chicago, now lives in St Peter. He has a brother who lives in Arizona and two sons.


Sports such as Ice Hockey, Football, and Baseball are of interest to Laddie as is playing his guitar. Laddie is a proud Veteran.


