

A Father Who Can Be Trusted

One of the most common human experiences has got to be the experience of feeling ashamed. All of us have done something wrong to the extent that we feel so bad that we beat ourselves up and tell ourselves we are worthless. And yet despite this being one of the most common experiences, our shame works overtime and tries to convince us that we are the only screw up. We are the only one to make that mistake and no one else is as bad as me. This of course is not

true, but our shame takes on a mind of its own and carries us down the river of self depreciation, self loathing, and self hate. I have been there, you have been there, we all have been there. But if I may, let me reason with you for a moment.

The fact that you have felt shame is a good sign. You have a conscience, you recognize the harm you have done, and can even picture a better way of handling things next time. But the problem most of us have is that we are too ashamed, we hang on to things for too long, and years down the road we are still beating ourselves up for things that others have long since forgotten, long since forgiven.

So let me say that you are not the only one to ever make a mistake. We are all human, we all make mistakes, and no one can judge you, only God can. John Newton was an English slave trader. You may not know the name but you have sung his song Amazing Grace. After recognizing the mistakes that he made he became a minister and he told his people, "If God can love a wretch like me, surely can love a wretch like you."

So it is true brothers and sisters, all of us find ourselves lost, yet God searches for his lost sheep until he finds us. No sin can separate us from his love, and we are never so lost that we cannot be found.

If you are breathing today that means God is not done with you, you still have a purpose to which God loves and God has called you to. Just like John Newton, God has saved you to continue to be his servant. But it is time to let go. We cannot be the servant God has called us to be if we are still beating ourselves up over the sins of our past. Only once we let go of the past can we move forward. So that is the choice we have to make. Will we let the past dictate our future? Or will we lay it down for the one who came to be sin, who knew no sin, and gave his life a ransom for many?



A new Lay Ministry Care Team has been developed. They have organized and begun making home visits to assist with the needs of our church community. The early responses to this ministry have been very positive.

I have developed this ministry as part of an assignment to develop a leadership project for my Seminary education. I chose to begin a ministry to assist Pastor Matthew and Pastor Scott Richards with the visitation needs of the churches. Although this is an "assignment", my intention is that this will be an ongoing ministry within the community for years to come.

For those wondering how this may affect Pastor Matthew's work, this does not replace his visiting schedule. It will allow people to be seen more frequently, between Pastor Matthew's home visits. It has been found to expand and strengthen the care within communities that incorporate this type of ministry.

Confidentiality is of utmost importance in this process. It is vital that this be a safe place to share what is on your heart, without judgment, and receive support, prayer, and God's love. Communion will also be available, for those who have been unable to attend church in person.

This will be a time of transition and learning for the whole team. More ministry efforts may develop as needs are recognized. I welcome any suggestions that you may have. Please contact Pastor or myself if you want a visit, or know of someone who wishes to be seen. We are also open to adding members to our team.

I want to take this time, also, to THANK the Church Council and Congregation for your support of my Seminary experience. \$500.00 were donated toward my education, which I am so grateful for. It is this kind of caring for our neighbors, that I wish to return to you, and continue in new ways in time to come.




