We are blessed to have our new members and thank them for their commitment to our church.



Letting It Shine?

I was a first generation college student and I feel very fortunate. My grandparents worked in a manufacturing plant, my parents worked in that same manufacturing plant, and although it would have made perfect sense for me to follow in their footsteps, after hearing my dad complain for years about the poor working conditions, and watching his body deteriorate, I knew I had to take a different route.

So after I graduated from high school, I attended college. For me, college was a wonderful experience. I did things that I never thought possible, I met people from all around the globe, and I learned how to live out in the world on my own. Which at the time was both terrifying and thrilling. Academically, I learned a lot, and I credit my professors for really pushing me to be a better reader and writer, and be more detail oriented. College also taught me a lot about work ethic, determination, and consistency.

Even after all these years I still remember studying one topic. That is the topic of nature versus nurture. The debate of nature verses nurture is one of the age-old debates, and if you have never heard of it, it is relatively easy to explain.

There are some who believe that our behavior is inherited genetically. Then there are those who believe that behavior is learned through our environment such as childhood experiences, how we were raised, and our surrounding culture.

At this point the debate is pretty much over. Most people would agree that it is not our genetics that determine our behavior, but rather our behavior is learned. Everything we do from eating, to tying our shoes, to how we treat other people is learned. I want to make the assertion that the same is true of discipleship.

One of the main concerns in the church today, is a decline in numbers. I hear the concerns of people who say there are so few people coming to church these days, or they say our young people just aren't interested in coming to church. Believe me, I am well aware. But if behaviors are learned and passed on, then isn't it up to us to fix the problem?

As the bible tells us, John the Baptist, although an odd character, spent much of his time testifying and pointing to Jesus as The Chosen One. On more than one occasion the testimony of John inspired people nearby to follow Jesus, and after spending time with Jesus, those people led others to Jesus. In other words, the testimony of John set off a chain reaction of testimony and discipleship.

Now based upon my years in the Lutheran church, there are a few things Lutherans do really well. Lutherans are really good at making Jell-O. I don't know if there is a Jell-O hall of fame, but if there is, we are in it. One more thing Lutherans do well is protect their pews. You want to see an angry Lutheran, just sit in their pew on Sunday morning. And Lutheran's are really good at remembering their family histories and studying them closely. But what Lutherans don't do well is share their personal testimony and invite people to church. I am just as guilty as the next person.

So this begs the question. How can we expect our youth to be interested in Jesus if we don't talk about him? How can we expect new people to come to church and follow Jesus, if we don't extend an invitation? How can we expect anyone to know Jesus or believe that Jesus even exists, if we are not willing to stand up and say Jesus has redeemed me, Jesus walks with me, Jesus loves me for who I am, and because I have Jesus in my life my life is better!

So, if we were to make some goals for the year our first goal should be to go out and tell people about the amazing treasure we have in Jesus. What does that look like? Sharing personal testimony, publicly confessing faith in Christ, extending an invitation to come to church, and by golly, if that means brining someone to meet Jesus, then do that. These aren't vague directions; these are concrete actions that we can make today.

Brothers and sisters, I love coming to church. Because when we come to church it brings us yet another opportunity to renew our commitment to follow Jesus, and rejoice in the good news, that even when we are imperfect, God's love for us remains steadfast. In a dark and weary world, we have the light of Jesus. My question is, should we hide it under a bush, or should we let it shine, let it shine? Amen.

The Congregation of Scandian Grove Lutheran Church gathered on February 12, 2023, for the Annual Meeting. Vice President Dick Kinkeade called the meeting to order at 10:21am.

Devotions by Pastor Matthew Garavalia

There's a sense of belonging here at Scandian Grove Lutheran Church. As we look to the past and plan for the future, SGLC has shown and continues to have a lot of grit and determination. Together, let's make this year ahead even better than we are right now. Let's challenge ourselves by asking, how much do we want to be an even stronger church for Jesus Christ?

Rhonda Hermanson read the 2022 Annual Meeting Secretary's Report. Solveig Olsen made a motion to approve the 2022 Annual Meeting Secretary's Minutes. Joni Anderson seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The 2023 Ballot was introduced by Vice President Kinkeade and handed out by Paul Engel and Anna Lokensgard.

- There is one position for Auditing with Marty Schott on the ballot. Fred Hanson made a motion to cease nominations for Auditing. 'Seconded by Beth Kinkeade. The motion carried.
- The ballot has Bruce Norell and Solveig Olsen down for Nominating Committee. Don Hermanson made a motion to cease nominations for the Nominating Committee. Seconded by Kelyse Engel. The motion carried.
- Vice President Kinkeade asked for all to prayerfully make their choice about the Fall Supper on the ballot.
- Pam Rogich made a motion to cast a unanimous ballot for the Church Council, Cemetery Board, Auditing, and Nominating Committee. Seconded by Maria Lokensgard. The motion carried.
- Tellers counted ballots to count fall supper votes while the meeting continued.

Bruce Norell presented the Financial Secretary's Report. Bill Kastens made a motion to accept the Financial Secretary's Report. Seconded by Kelyse Engel. The motion carried.

Vicki Hermanson presented the Treasurer's Report. Joni Anderson made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report. Seconded by Jim Allerson. The motion carried.

Bruce Norell presented the 2023 proposed budget on behalf of the Finance Committee, inviting the congregation to read through the proposed budget. He then opened the floor up for questions. Kelyse Engel made a motion to accept the Committee's approved budget of \$157,717 as presented. Seconded by Pam Rogich. The motion carried.

Pastor Matthew Garavalia presented the Statistical Report.

Vice President Kinkeade formally thanked the Church Council members, Pastor Matthew Garavalia, and several people for their faithful service: Church Secretary Anna Lokensgard, Treasurer Vicki Hermanson, Newsletter and Website Editor Bonnie Rieger, Organists Marie Engel and Beth Kinkeade, Choir Director Scott Hermanson, Custodians Pam Rogich and Wanda Enter, Church Lawn Caretakers Wallace and Kazuko Larson, Cemetery Lawn Caretaker Cole Pankratz, the Snow Removal Crew, and the many Committees and Coordinators of the special events over the past year.




