Bring a chair and dress for the weather!




There will be a joint choir singing at the Tractor Roll In. If interested, talk to Pastor or watch for communication from Scott Hermanson.

Answering The Call To Serve

Greetings, beloved members of Scandian Grove Lutheran Church!

As we take a moment once again to celebrate our faith and reflect on the teachings of Jesus, we turn our attention to a powerful and transformative passage found in the Gospel of John: John 21:1-19. This narrative captures a momentous encounter between Jesus and His disciples by the Sea of Galilee, an encounter that holds deep significance for us as followers of Christ.

In this passage, we find the disciples, who had witnessed the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus, returning to their former occupation as fishermen. As they toiled throughout the night, their efforts seemed in vain as they caught nothing. However, as morning dawned, a familiar figure stood on the shore, calling out to them, "Children, do you have any fish?"

Little did they know that this encounter would be a turning point in their lives. Jesus, the risen Lord, revealed Himself to them and urged them to cast their nets on the right side of the boat. The result was miraculous. Their nets were soon overflowing with an abundance of fish they could hardly contain.

This extraordinary catch of fish, symbolic of the great harvest of souls that awaited them, caused the disciples whom Jesus loved to recognize their Lord. Peter, ever impulsive and full of passion, couldn't contain his excitement. He jumped into the water and swam ashore to be with Jesus.

What followed was a profound exchange between Jesus and Peter. As they shared a meal together, Jesus asked Peter three times, "Do you love me?" Each time Peter affirmed his love for Jesus, and each time Jesus responded with a commission: "Feed my lambs," "Tend my sheep," and "Feed my sheep."

In this interaction, Jesus restored Peter, who had denied Him three times before His crucifixion. Jesus not only forgave Peter but also entrusted him with the responsibility of shepherding His flock, caring for His people, and sharing the good news of salvation. Peter's love for Jesus was to be manifested through his service to others.

Dear friends, this passage holds a powerful message for us today. Just as Jesus called Peter to serve, He also calls each one of us to serve in His name. We are called to be fishers of men, casting wide our nets to bring others into the fold of God's love and grace.

Like the disciples, we may at times feel discouraged, facing empty nets in our efforts to serve and share the Gospel. But in those moments, we must remember that Jesus stands on the shore, ready to guide us and provide the abundant catch we seek. We need only to trust in His guidance, casting our nets with faith and perseverance.

Moreover, this passage reminds us of the importance of love and forgiveness. Jesus asked Peter three times if he loved Him, mirroring the three denials Peter had made. Jesus showed us that love and forgiveness are not only powerful acts of grace but also the foundation for meaningful service in His kingdom.

Let us take this message to heart and respond to the call to serve. Let us be diligent in our efforts to share the love of Christ, to care for those in need, and to extend forgiveness and reconciliation to one another. May our love for Jesus be revealed through our actions as we serve as His ambassadors in the world.

As we reflect on John 21:1-19, let us pray for the strength, wisdom, and courage to answer the call to serve. May we, like Peter, respond wholeheartedly to Jesus' question, "Do you love me?" and may our resounding answer be, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." May our love for Him be evident in the way we live our lives and serve those around us.

May God bless you abundantly as you continue to follow in the footsteps of our Lord Jesus Christ. In His service,

PROPERTY

A new air conditioner was installed in the parsonage.

The Property Committee will create a recommendation about who can adjust the church thermostat to save on electricity monthly billing.

The recommendation for big coffeemaker: Make sure you clean out the machine (grounds and coffee in it) after each use and always wet the coffee filter before new grounds are added.

EDUCATION

We will host a Sunday School Round-Up on Sunday, August 20, 2023, to introduce the year ahead.

Missions

Serving at "The Kitchen" - Rhonda Hermanson has joined Joni Anderson representing SGLC on the board for *The Kitchen*. They meet every three weeks, on Wednesday evenings. SGLC will next serve a Monday in October.

HISTORICAL COMMITTEE

The 165th Anniversary of SGLC, on July 23, 2023, was a success, with 91 in worship and 90 people for brunch. The Pioneer Building was cleaned and open to all. Pastor Bob Stover and Karen Humphrey represented former pastors attending. The free-will offering covered the cost of the catered brunch from Gustavus, and the remaining funds of \$269.12 will be used for upkeep by the Historical Committee. Joni Anderson interviewed Garfield Eckberg and Byron Norell to share the history of the SGLC cemeteries.

Confirmands and Pastors of SGLC pictures from the library are being put into 12 x 12 scrapbooks. A new "In Remembrance" Memorial Book has been purchased. This Committee will record Memorial Gift items donated to the church.



LINCOLN, LITTLE CROW, AND THE BEGINNING OF THE FRONTIER'S END

By Scott W. Berg





Meeting at Trinity Sibley (rural Gaylord)

In August 1862, after suffering decades of hardship, broken treaties, and relentless encroachment on their land, the Dakota leader Little Crow reluctantly agreed that his people must go to war. After six weeks of fighting, the uprising was smashed, thousands of Indians were taken prisoner by the U.S. Army, and 303 Dakotas were sentenced to death. President Lincoln, embroiled in the most devastating period of the Civil War, personally intervened to save the lives of 265 of the condemned men, but in the end, 38 Dakota men would be hanged in the largest government-sanctioned execution in United States history.

Writing with uncommon immediacy and insight, Scott W. Berg details these events within the larger context of the Civil War, the history of the Dakota people and the subsequent United States-Indian wars, and brings to life this overlooked but seminal moment in American history.


Today I pray for two cups...two cups of diligence and joy and love. And more than all the rest, Lord, please bless me with two cups of peace. May I give peace and be at peace.
