

Vicki H asked for a motion to move \$30,500 into a Mission Fund CD to earmark for five years, \$10,500 will come from our checking account and \$20,000 will be deposited from a held check. The CD will be called The 2024 Anonymous Gift Fund. Motion made by Rhonda H, seconded by Pam R. Motion passed.

#### **CHRISTIAN EDUCATION**

Emily Kleppe will be the Chairperson. The goals for 2024 will be to pick Sunday School Curriculum in Spring 2024, and begin planning VBS in Fall 2024

#### **HISTORICAL COMMITTEE**

Heidi Scheurer will be the Chairperson. The Committee is wanting to fix the windows on the Pioneer Building, they are still looking for a tradesperson to take on that task. Their goals for this year will be updating the Confirmation Pictures into a book, continuing the History Video Projects, and talks of updating the Ryan W. Book of Dates.

#### SOCIAL MISSIONS

Rhonda Hermanson is the Chairperson. Main Mission is "The Kitchen."

#### WORSHIP AND MUSIC

Solveig O is the Chairperson. Goals would be to continue to find new ways to incorporate prayer for the world, find more common hymns to sing during communion on the first Sunday of the month, and to try dialogical preaching on the fifth Sunday of the month.

Green hymnals have been delivered to a few nursing homes in the surrounding area. Pam R still has about 20 to give away. Scandian Grove will keep 17 copies at church.

Pam R led a discussion about Large Print Hymnals for a few worshiping members that have trouble

reading the regular print hymnals. The Council agreed that it is well worth the expense to make worship accessible to everyone. Pam R made a motion to buy five copies of the Large Print Red Hymnal using funds from the Memorial Fund, seconded by Gary M. Motion passed.

#### PROPERTY

The Committee Co-chairs are Byron Norell and Blake Webster. The 2024 goals are to clear brush and plant new trees in the outer grove, get new furnaces, explore the leaks in the roof, assessment of the parsonage needs, clean the registers, manage pests inside and out, and move the lights over the pulpit.

There is also a need to paint the Pioneer Building.

Gary M made a motion to purchase two new furnaces for the Church Sanctuary per the recommendation of the Property Committee; money is to be taken from the Improvement Fund and the General Fund, seconded by Rhonda H. Motion passed.

Pam R will contact Echo Lab for an estimate for Church Pest Control.

#### TECHNOLOGY

The Chairperson is David Kleppe. Their 2024 goals are to look into the appropriate use of microphones, and to purchase a new projector.

#### **Stewardship**

Jeff Allerson is the Chairperson. Their 2024 goals will be to have one Temple Talk and to distribute and collect Time & Talent Sheets.




