Second Congregational Vote Notification to Approve Updated Scandian Grove Draft Constitution The Annual Scandian Grove Lutheran Church Congregational Meeting will be held after the church service on Sunday, February 11, 2024.

The agenda will include a second Congregational vote to accept the changes made to the 2010 version of the Scandian Grove Lutheran Church Constitution.

- 10 percent of Scandian Grove's voting members shall constitute a quorum.
- Voting by proxy or by absentee ballot shall not be permitted.
- ★ Constitution update approval requires a two-thirds vote of those voting members present and

The first Congregational vote to approve the adoption of the updated Constitution resulted in 61 yes votes and 1 no vote. This vote was taken at the Special Congregational Meeting conducted on Sunday. December 3, 2023.

# What Are You Holding On To

Fishing takes patience. The first time you cast your line you're probably not going to catch anything or the second time for that matter. And that is why fishing takes patience. And fishing also requires determination! And of course these things go together, if you don't have much patience, you are not going to have any determination. It takes determination; you gotta keep at it, not just once, not just twice, not just three times, 50 times? Maybe.

And fishing also takes positivity. You have to have positivity for fishing because when you cast over and

over again and your line is empty, it is positivity that keeps you going. But first and foremost, fishing takes patience. And fishing takes faith too, doesn't it? Because in fishing, you have to believe that eventually you are going to catch what you are fishing for.

In the fifth chapter of Luke's gospel Jesus shows up on the banks of Lake Gennesaret, we are told that a crowd pressed in around him, because by this time, Jesus' teaching had begun to draw large crowds. As the crowd filled in around Jesus, Jesus looked out over the water and saw fishing boats, one of which belonged to Simon. So he got into Simon's boat, sat down, and began teaching.

When Jesus finished teaching, he looked to Simon and said, Simon, head out into the deep water and put your nets out. At this point, Simon was filled with doubt and had run out of patience. Judging by the tone in his voice, you can just sense his defeat. "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing, but if you say so, I will let down the nets."

I can't say I blame Simon for doubting nor can I blame him for losing patience. After all, Simon is dependent on catching fish to make a living, and as the hours pass by, Simon grows more desperate, more doubtful, and more impatient. Even though none of us are commercial fishermen, I am sure that there are many times in our lives where we have felt just like Simon; times when we have grown desperate, impatient, and downright doubtful.

As Simon James and John let down their nets suddenly their nets were filled with fish, so many fish that their nets began to break. Calling for help the men were able to get the fish into the boat and as they did so, the boat began to sink! For Simon and his partners James and John, this is the moment that God's grace came through. God's grace came through and filled those nets not just to the top of the nets, but those nets were overflowing! They were so full that they began to break!

There in that moment of doubt and desperation and impatience, those nets were filled! Those nets were filled with fish, but really those nets were filled with God's grace, filled with God's overwhelming, neverending, overflowing grace!

This story reminds us of the promise that God gives to each one of us. No matter where we find ourselves, no matter how impatient we grow, no matter how desperate the situation that we find ourselves in, it is the grace of God that shows up, it is God's grace that shows up and fills our lives with the overflowing love, grace, and mercy of Jesus Christ!

The promise that God makes is that in the midst of the struggles and pitfalls of life, in the midst of the disasters, brokenness, and suffering, God promises to show up and fill our lives with overwhelming overflowing abundant grace. In our severest moment of desperation, doubt, and impatience, God's grace will be so full in our lives that our nets will begin to break.

Broken nets from an American point of view are a bad thing. Broken nets mean more cost, more time, and a stop in production. For Simon, James and John, broken nets meant that they were finally able, finally able to let go of what they were holding on to and follow Jesus.

So what are you holding on to? What are you grasping so tightly that you just can't seem to let go? Fear, worry, doubt? What are you holding on to that prevents you from holding on to the one who will never let you down, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. I know that it's difficult to have faith in hard times but that my brothers and sisters is what we are called to do. We are called to follow Jesus in faith, trusting that just like for Simon, James and John, God's grace will come through and fill our nets. Amen. Page 2



- Send the funds to a Charity of your choice.


