

<u>NOTE!</u> Congregational Vote To Approve Updated Scandian Grove Draft Constitution The Annual Scandian Grove Lutheran Church Congregational Meeting will be held after the church service on Sunday, February 11, 2024.


The agenda will include a second Congregational vote to accept the changes made to the 2010 version of the Scandian Grove Lutheran Church Constitution.

- + 10 percent of Scandian Grove's voting members shall constitute a quorum.
- Voting by proxy or by absentee ballot shall not be permitted.
- Constitution update approval requires a two-thirds vote of those voting members present and voting.

The first Congregational vote to approve the adoption of the updated Constitution resulted in 61 yes votes and 1 no vote. This vote was taken at the Special Congregational Meeting conducted on Sunday, December 3, 2023.

Carpets in the church cleaned. Kitchen and bathrooms sanitized for a total cost of \$1,580. The carpets are cleaned on a 2 year rotation.




